



These are the main changes to *Cambridge English: Starters* from January 2018:

Paper	Part	What's been updated?
Listening		There is a new Part 1 task. Instead of placing objects on the picture, children will need to match names to people. This is now the same task as <i>Cambridge: English Movers</i> and <i>Flyers</i> Part 1, but is targeted at Pre-A1 level.
Reading and Writing	Part 1	Now has both plural and singular nouns.
Reading and Writing	Part 4	There is now a semi-factual text instead of a riddle.
Speaking	Part 1	The test is now made up of four tasks. This new part combines the content from the existing Part 1 and 2.
Speaking	Part 1	The examiner will now ask the child their name.
Speaking	Part 2	An additional question has been added. Children now need to talk about the picture, rather than point (for example 'Tell me about').

Listening	Part 5	Children no longer have to draw as part of this question. They will now write a word.
Reading and Writing	All parts	Across all six parts there are now 35 questions, instead of 40.
Reading and Writing	Part 1	There are now only five questions, instead of six.
Reading and Writing	Part 3	There are now only six questions, instead of seven.
Reading and Writing	Part 5	There are now only seven questions, instead of ten.
Reading and Writing	Part 6	This is a new writing task. This new task replaces the existing Part 2 task.
Speaking	Part 1	The examiner will now ask the child their name and age.
Speaking	Part 2	The story now has a title and the characters have been given names to provide
		appropriate context and support.

These are the main changes to *Cambridge English: Flyers* from January 2018:

Paper	Part	What's been updated?
Listening	Part 5	Children will no longer be asked to draw as part of this question; they will now write the word.
Reading and Writing	All parts	Across all seven parts, there are now 44 questions instead of 50.
Reading and Writing	Part 3	The word options children are asked to select from are now placed before the text.
Reading and Writing	Part 7	This is a new writing task. This new task replaces the existing Part 2 task.
Speaking	Part 1	The examiner will now ask the child their name, family name and age.
Speaking	IPart 3	The story now has a title and the characters have been given names to provide appropriate context and support.
